





I was 20 years old when I got busted. I never figured that my life would take this route but after being sentence to almost 25 years at age 22 I have been forced to deal with the consequences of my actions. Not that I'm saying the punishment fits the crime because it doesn't. However like I learned when I first started fucking around with drugs at age 13, if you're gonna do the crime then you gotta do the time. You can't point your finger at the next man. Still most do. But for me it's a matter of being able to look myself in the mirror and asking myself, could I live with myself by making someone else's family cry? And for me the answer has always been no. But that's just me. I'm not here to enforce my ideals on the next man. They have to make that decision for themselves. I was a twenty year old first-time non-violent offender from the suburbs and I took mine and got cracked in the head as a result. But 14 years in I'm still doing it. Not like I'm some tough guy or go hard killer convict. Its Just a state of mind. I can't scam you, beat you, cheat you, take advantage of you or snitch on you. That's just how I carry it. All I got are my word and my balls. And my word is bond.
